CIVIL AIR PATROL UNIFORM MANUAL

CAPM 39-1, 23 March 2005, is supplemented as follows:

Table 1-3. Added. The following shoulder cords are authorized. Members meeting the requirements have the choice either to wear or not wear a cord. The cord may be worn for the entire time the member is a member of the team, activity or program for which the cord was authorized. Only one cord will be worn at a time. Cords may only be worn with the Air Force-style service uniforms (with or without service coat).

(1) A RED shoulder cord may be worn by all primary members of the Wing Cadet Advisory Council, during the period of time they serve on the council. A DARK GREEN cord may be worn by primary members of the Group Cadet Advisory Council.

(2) A WHITE shoulder cord may be worn by members of the current year Maryland Wing Drill Team and Maryland Wing Color Guard. The year will begin on the date of the Middle East Region Cadet Competitions.

(3) A GOLD/BLACK shoulder cord may be worn by cadets who have distinguished themselves academically by being placed on their school's honor roll. Proof of this award must be documented by a copy of the cadet's report card, a certificate naming the cadet to the honor roll, or any other method deemed appropriate by the Squadron Commander or Deputy Commander for Cadets. A CAPF-2A will be filled out each quarter (semester) for the award, with a copy of the documentation attached. If a cadet is not named to the school's honor roll the shoulder cord will be removed.

(4) A DARK GREEN/WHITE shoulder cord may be worn by the Cadet of the Quarter for each squadron for the subsequent quarter after being chosen. The squadron may select the Cadet of the Quarter by any means deemed appropriate by the Squadron Commander. In large squadrons of 50 or more cadets, this cord may be worn to identify the Cadet of the Month.

1-3. Added. No berets will be worn in Maryland Wing in order to maintain uniformity for all members throughout the wing.

(1) Cadet officers may wear the Service Cap.


(2) CAP Baseball Cap – Cotton/polyester, adjustable –one size fits all, medium crown, large visor, color black will be worn with the utility uniform. (BDU and

Lettering 3/4" in size, embroidered (Block type font –all caps) gold in color, centered 2" above the visor with MD-XXX (XXX to be the charter number of the unit the member is assigned to ex- MD-001, MD-071, MD-330). Cadets and Senior member officers may wear embroidered grade insignia centered below the lettering. Thread color for silver grade is white. A preferred vendor for purchase of hats will be selected by MDWG HQ for uniformity of style and savings in price.

Table 6-4, Item 10. Added. Organizational Emblem (Group or Squadron patches). Each group or squadron desiring to create a patch for their organization must submit to the Wing Commander a request in writing, with a color drawing, defining every point, color, use, symbol and purpose of the patch. A Squadron patch must use a circular shaped shield or disc as illustrated below, be at least two and one half inches in height/width but no larger than three inches in height/width. No patches shall be ordered or manufactured prior to written approval. The patch may be worn only on the BDU blouse, Utility uniform, and field uniform as shown in Table 6-4. Group patches must use a shield design as shown below.



Units with existing organizational emblems are encouraged to modify the design when new patches are ordered to comply with the current design criteria.
