Subject: Cap Device for Civil Air Patrol Officers

To: All Unit Commanders

1. The Office of the Quartermaster General has approved a design to be worn on service caps by officers only. The design adopted consists of our regulation cap disc, except that it is smaller (1 inch in diameter) and silver wings are attached in a vertical position.

- 2. This cap device may be purchased from the Robbins Company, Attleboro, Massachusetts (\$1.75 including tax), or from the Green Company, Kansas City, Missouri (\$1.65 including tax). Check or money order should accompany the order.
- 3. Since this cap device embodies the basic Civil Air Patrol patented design, it may be ordered only through Wing, Group or Squadron Supply Officers. Orders placed by individuals cannot be accepted by the companies licensed by the Office of Civilian Defense to make and sell these articles. To prevent unauthorized use of the insignia, it is required that all orders be approved in writing by the National Commander, the appropriate Wing Commander or a deputized Supply Officer signing the Wing Commander's name (see GM-40 dated July 2, 1942). Many complaints as to slow deliveries are due to the fact that this procedure, required by Office of Civilian Defense regulations, has not been followed and manufacturers have been obliged to return orders for the proper confirmation.
