Chapter I

GENERAL INFORMATION

1-1. Policy:

- a. All Civil Air Patrol cadets, and senior members who conduct the cadet training program, will wear the CAP uniform. Other senior members are not required to wear a uniform, but when the uniform is worn, members will adhere to the rules prescribed in this manual.
- b. Civil Air Patrol members are authorized to wear a uniform similar to the Air Force uniform, the difference being that distinctive emblems, buttons, insignia, and badges are employed to identify the wearer as a member of CAP. These differences from the Air Force uniform are as prescribed by the National Commander of CAP with the approval of Headquarters USAF.
- Various combinations of uniforms are authorized herein in order to allow for various climatic conditions, availability of uniforms, etc., but no member is expected to equip himself with all or even a major part of the combinations described in this manual. The minimum basic uniform for male and female seniors and cadets which will satisfy most occasions is listed below. Members may obtain and wear other uniforms authorized in this manual on an optional basis. The National Commander and other commanders may specify the wearing of a particular uniform type for the purpose of achieving a uniform appearance at squadron, group, wing, regional, and national functions. All commanders must be mindful of the objective of attaining a neatly uniformed group at a minimum of personal expense to the members; consequently, they will refrain from imposing unreasonable uniform requirements. It is a member's personal responsibility to equip himself with a proper uniform. Commanders may assist if they have the capability, through use of unit funds, donations, or by acquiring surplus uniforms. Cadets will not be required to purchase the blue uniform. A commander may require cadets to wear this uniform only if the purchase is voluntary or the uniform has been supplied without expense to the cadets.

- d. Variations from the uniforms, uniform combinations, and insignia contained in this manual are not authorized. Exceptions, if any, for national events will be contained in separate directives from National Headquarters.
- 1-2. When The Uniform Is Worn. The service uniform is worn when engaged in normal duties as a CAP member. It is worn while attending local, area, or national CAP functions.
- 1-3. When Wear of the Uniform Is Prohibited. CAP members will not wear the uniform:
- a. At any meeting or demonstration carried out or sponsored by an organization, association, movement, group, or combination of persons that:
- (1) The Attorney General of the United States has designated as totalitarian, Fascist, Communist, or subversive.
- (2) Advocates or approves the commission of acts of force or violence to deny others their rights under the Constitution of the United States
- (3) Seeks to alter the form of the United States Government by unconstitutional means.
- b. Under any circumstances that would tend to bring discredit or reproach upon the uniform.
 - c. When engaged in civilian employment.
- 1-4. Dress and Appearance. Each member of the CAP must be well-groomed and assure that his personal appearance at all times reflects credit upon himself and the CAP. Each will meet the following minimum requirements when in uniform:
- a. Appearance of Uniform. When uniforms are worn, they must be clean, neat, correct in design and specification, and in good condition. Uniforms will be kept buttoned and shoes must be

shined and in good repair. Metallic insignia, badges, and other metallic devices including the blue service uniform buttons, also must be maintained in the proper luster and condition.

b. Personal Appearance - Men:

- (1) The face will be kept clean-shaven, but a short, neatly trimmed mustache may be worn. A beard may be worn only when temporarily approved by medical officials for medical reasons. Such approval will be limited initially to three months, but may be extended if considered necessary by the medical authorities.
- (2) Hair must be neat and closely trimmed. It may be clipped at the edges of the sides and back, but must present an evenly graduated appearance. Long and couspicuous sideburns are prohibited.
- (3) Articles such as pencils, pens, watch chains, fobs, pins, jewelry, handkerchiefs, combs, cigars, cigarettes, pipes, and sunglasses cases will not be worn or carried exposed on the uniform. The wearing of wristwatches, identification bracelets, and rings is permitted. Conservative sunglasses may be worn, but not in military formations.

c. Personal Appearance - Women:

- (1) Hair will be neatly arranged and shaped to present a conservative feminine appearance. Back hair may touch but not fall below the bottom of the collar. Hair styles that prevent the proper wearing of the flight capor service hat are not appropriate. Barrettes, ribbons, and other ornaments, except inconspicuous pins and combs, will not be worn in the hair when the uniform is worn. Hair nets will be worn only when authorized for a specific type of duty. Hair coloring may be used if it looks natural and complements skin tones.
- (2) Cosmetics will be conservative and in good taste.
- (3) Pencils, pens, pins, handkerchiefs, and jewelry will not be worn or carried exposed on the uniform. Wear of earrings is prohibited, but rings may be worn. Conservative sunglasses may be worn, except in military formations.

1-5. Purchase of Uniform Items by Individuals:

- a. Articles of Uniform Clothing. CAP members are authorized to purchase such articles from any of the following sources:
 - (1) Base Exchanges. See CAPR 147-1.
- (2) USAF Clothing Sales Stores. This should be the primary source of uniform clothing for CAP members. The following rules apply:
- (a) To be eligible to purchase from a clothing sales store a member must possess a current membership card. All authorized

purchases in a clothing sales store will be for cash only. All distinctive USAF buttons will be removed from outer garments prior to the sale of such items to CAP personnel. If clothing sales store personnel question their authority to sell to CAP members they should be asked to make reference to Paragraph 51, Chap 2, Vol I, Part 3, AFM 67-1.

- (b) In the event a clothing sales store is not avaibable, purchases may be made by mail order. In such cases, send a Mail Order Requisition (AF Form 662) in duplicate, to Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio 45433, if you live in the Continental United States or Puerto Rico; to FC 5000, Elmendorf AFB, Alaska 99506, if you live in Alaska; or to FC 5260, Hickam AFB, Hawaii 96824, if you live in Hawaii. The requisition must be accompanied by a money order or certified check payable to the Treasurer of the United States. Payment must be for the exact amount of the purchase. If you do not have a current price list, which changes periodically, (AFR 67-57), you should contact your nearest clothing sales store or write to Wright-Patterson AFB. If for some reason your order cannot be completely filled, a government check will be sent for the balance due the person ordering. All postage fees are paid by the government.
- (c) Since certain items are considered common items and may be purchased from commercial sources, the following items are not authorized for sale to CAP members:

Men: Towels, underwear, socks, shoes, and insignia.

Women: Towels, hosiery, and insignia.

- (d) If requisition forms (AF Form 662) are required, the member should contact the unit supply or administrative services officer. Also the forms may be requisitioned from the Director of Administrative Services, National Headquarters, Civil Air Patrol.
- (3) Commercial Sources. When purchasing uniform clothing from commercial sources, the following should be kept in mind:
- (a) All uniform items sold in clothing sales stores conform to Air Force specifications.
- (b) All uniform items sold in base exchanges conform to the specification for either required or optional items. All dress items and accessories must contain the USAF certification label.
- (c) Personnel who purchase uniform items from other sources are advised to establish the reliability of the seller and make sure that each garment purchased contains the certification label shown in (e) below.

- (d) Since clothing sales and base exchanges operate at a low mark up, individuals should be exceedingly cautious about purchasing items from commercial sources at bargain prices. The items offered may have been rejected by Government purchases, fail to conform to specifications, or be in the process of discontinuation as an approved item.
- (e) The purchaser must insure that each uniform item he buys contains the following certification label, sewed permanently to the garment: "USAF CERTIFICATE NO.____. A sample of this item has been inspected and meets or exceeds the quality prescribed by AF Specification____." Approved items of optional uniform clothing bearing a previously authorized AMC or ARDC certification label may be worn until no longer serviceable.
- (4) Excess/Surplus Sources. The United States Air Force makes excess and surplus equipment available to the Civil Air Patrol and in some cases this includes uniform clothing articles. Such articles as are made available normally consist of odd sizes or discontinued items. However, it is advisable to check with the CAP unit material officer to ascertain if he has access to uniform articles which may fit members of the unit.
- b. Distinctive CAP Insignia and Devices. Distinctive insignia and devices such as the CAP identification badge, collar and lapel insignia, buttons, and other items prescribed herein may be purchased from approved commercial sources or from the CAP Bookstore. A list of articles handled by the CAP Bookstore, together with prices and ordering instructions, is contained in the current Catalog of Aerospace Education and Training Materials.
- 1-6. Wear of the Uniform in Foreign Countries. Most foreign governments prohibit the wearing of military uniforms by visitors. Personnel will not wear a CAP uniform in a foreign country except for members on orders to participate in the International Air Cadet Exchange or other international events for which National Head-quarters has expressly authorized the wearing of the uniform.

- 1-7. Command Responsibility. Commanders will insure that personnel, individually and collectively, present a well-groomed apppearance which will reflect credit upon CAP as an auxiliary of the United States Air Force. They will make certain that personnel are uniformed in accordance with the provisions of this manual; that uniform violations are promptly corrected; and that through inspections, instructional periods, etc., members are informed as to the proper wearing of the uniform.
- 1-8. Definition of Terms. As used in this manual the word "officer" includes all grades from warrant officer through colonel, both senior and cadet. The term "airman", unless otherwise specified, includes all other members with or without grade, both senior and cadet. The term "service uniform" means the tan and blue uniforms worn on normal duty or dress occasions. It excludes fatigue clothing, flying suits, sports clothing, and recreational clothing.
- 1-9. How to Recommend Uniform Changes. New or changed uniform items may not be authorized without approval of the National Uniform Committee and/or National Headquarters (except as specified in Chapter 7 of this manual).
- a. The National Uniform Committee which is composed of senior CAP members is responsible for maintaining a plain, but distinctive uniform and a consistent policy on all uniform matters. It takes advantage of the collective judgment and experience of senior CAP members to develop and select items of uniform clothing, accessories, and insignia, and to develop policies about items to be recommended to the National Executive Committee and/or National Board for approval.
- b. Unit commanders will forward recommended changes to the uniform, accessories, or related items through channels to National Head-quarters (CPPC). These suggestions will be forwarded to the National Uniform Committee for evaluation. National Headquarters will advise the unit of the committee's approval or disapproval. Suggestions not recommended for adoption by the wing headquarters should not be forwarded to National Headquarters.

Chapter 2

UNIFORMS FOR MEN (SENIORS AND CADETS)

SECTION A - SERVICE UNIFORMS





Figure 2-1. Example of Various Uniform Combinations (Men)

- 2-1. Uniform Combinations. Uniform combinations 1 through 6, shown in table 2-1, comprise the various CAP service uniforms for men (illustrated by figure 2-1). The "Xs" shown in the vertical columns of the table designate clothing items which must be worn with the various combinations unless otherwise indicated in column C. Combinations are briefly identified as follows:
- a. Combination 1. Lightweight and heavyweight blue service uniforms.
- b. Combination 2. Heavyweight blue service uniform with blue flannel shirt.
- c. Combination 3. Heavyweight blue service trousers with blue flannel shirt and lightweight blue wool/polyester service trousers with blue wool/polyester shirt.
 - d. Combination 4. Tan service uniform.

- e. Combination 5. Tan service shirt with bermuda shorts.
- f. Combination 6. The lightweight and heavyweight blue service uniforms may be worn with white shirt and black bow tie as a semiformal dress uniform.
- 2-2. Special Wear Instructions for Uniform Items. Combinations 3, 4, and 5 may not be worn in establishments where the coat and tie is the normal dress. Combination 6 may be worn on occasions when civilian dinner jacket (tuxedo) is also appropriate.
- 2-3. Fitting Instructions for Uniform Items. See table 2-1.
- 2-4. Description and Materials of Authorized Uniform Items. See table 2-2 for description and materials of clothing items which may be worn with the service uniforms.




Figure 2-2. Overcoat, Raincoat, and Topcoat (Men).





Figure 2-3. (Optional) Lightweight Jacket






Figure 2-4. (Optional) Blue Winter Cap.

SECTION B - UTILITY UNIFORMS

2-5. General. The work utility uniform as shown in table 2-3 is the authorized CAP utility uniform. The "Xs" shown in the vertical columns of the table designate the items which should be worn with the utility uniforms unless otherwise indicated in column D. Commanders are urged to encourage their personnel to wear these items as soon as they become available. Only those items shown in table 2-3 and 2-4 may be worn

on the utility uniform unless special authority to wear other items is granted by National Headquarters, CAP.

2-6. When the Work Utility Uniform May Be Worn. The work utility uniform may be prescribed for wear while performing duty at the unit training site, while on an actual or practice mission, and when traveling by private vehicle between residence and place of duty.

SECTION C - FLYING AND RECREATIONAL CLOTHING

2-7. What May Be Worn. The type of clothing to be worn while flying or engaging in organized recreational activities, in lieu of authorized service uniforms described in this manual, will be as prescribed by wing commanders or by commanders to whom they have delegated this authority. Experience has shown that it is impractical to require uniformity in this type clothing throughout CAP; therefore, National

Headquarters will not prescribe the type of clothing to be worn for these activities. However, any of the uniforms prescribed in Sections A and B of this chapter may be worn while flying. When an Air Force flight suit is worn, it will not be worn off the flight line. The use of cloth badges and grade insignia is encouraged on flight suits and uniforms worn while flying.

SECTION D - MESS DRESS UNIFORM (Senior Members Only)

- 2-8. What May be Worn. Mess dress uniform items authorized for wear by senior members are illustrated and described in detail in Figure 2-5.
- 2-9. When the Mess Dress May be Worn. The mess dress uniform may be worn by senior members at CAP functions when semiformal civilian dress (dinner jacket and black tie) is appropriate (normally not before 1800 hours) such as at evening
- parties, dinners, dances, receptions, and evening ceremonies. Seasonal wear will conform to local USAF policy.
- 2-10. Where the Mess Dress will be Procured. The mess dress uniform will be procured only through USAF base exchanges or the CAP Bookstore.



UNIFORMS FOR WOMEN (SENIOR AND CADET)

SECTION A - SERVICE UNIFORMS

- 3-1. Uniform Combinations. Uniform combinations A through G, shown on table 3-1, comprise the various CAP service and flight uniforms for women (illustrated by figure 3-2). The "Xs" shown in the vertical columns of the table designate clothing items which must be worn with the various combinations unless otherwise indicated in column C. Combinations are briefly identified as follows:
- a. Combination A. Lightweight blue service uniform.
- b. Combination B. Heavyweight blue service uniform.
- c. Combination C. Blue and white striped service uniform (cotton/polyester).
- d. Combination D. Blue service uniform skirt with overblouse style service shirt.
- e. Combination E. (Heavyweight blue wool flight uniform. Deleted as the uniform is no longer available.)
- f. Combination F. Lightweight blue flight uniform (cotton).

- g. Combination G. The lightweight and heavyweight blue service uniforms may be worn with a white shirt as a semiformal dress uniform. The shirt must be button down front (3 buttons), yoke back, quarter-length sleeves, and dark blue collar undertabs. Long sleeves and French cuffs or barrel cuffs are optional. The material may be silk, cotton, synthetics, or a blend thereof.
- 3-2. Special Wear Instructions for Uniform Items. See table 3-1.
- 3-3. Fitting Instructions for Uniform Items. See table 3-1.
- 3-4. Wear of Service Uniforms. The blue and the blue and white striped service uniforms are authorized for wear except when prohibited by chapter 1.
- 3-5. Description and Materials of Authorized Uniform Items. See table 3-2 for descriptions and materials of clothing items which may be worn with the service and flight uniforms.

SECTION B - FLIGHT UNIFORM/FIELD SUIT

- 3-6. Authorized Utility Uniform for Women. The flight uniform (Combination F) as shown in table 3-1 and the field suit as shown in table 3-3 comprise the authorized CAP "utility" uniform for women. Only those items shown in tables 3-1 and 3-3 may be worn as a part of the flight uniform/field suit.
- 3-7. When the Flight Uniform/Field Suit May be Worn. Combination F (flight uniform/field suit) is authorized for wear as follows:
- a. To travel on CAP aircraft or military aircraft when parachutes are required. (Flying clothing will not be worn off the flight line).

- b. During field duty or under field conditions.
- c. While performing work details in the office and at encampments and for physical conditioning classes.
- d. To perform duties that cannot be performed while wearing any other uniform combination.

When weather conditions warrant, organization clothing such as the blue sweater, field jacket, and parka may be prescribed for wear over the flight uniform/field suit by the local commander.




Figure 3-1. Overcoat, Raincoat and Topcoat/Raincoat (Women)




Figure 3—2. Service and Flight Uniforms

SECTION C - MESS DRESS UNIFORM (SENIOR MEMBERS ONLY)


Figure 3-3. Description of Women's Mess Dress Uniform Items

- 3-8. What May Be Worn. Mess dress uniform items authorized for wear by female senior members are illustrated and described in detail in figure 3-3.
- 3-9. When the Mess Dress May Be Worn. The mess dress uniform may be worn by senior members at CAP functions when semiformal civilian dress (dinner jacket and black tie) is
- appropriate (normally not before 1800 hours) such as at evening parties, dinners, dances, receptions, and evening ceremonies. Seasonal wear will conform to local USAF policy.
- 3-10. Where the Mess Dress Will Be Procured. The mess dress uniform will be procured only through USAF base exchanges or the CAP Bookstore.

AWARDS, DECORATIONS, AND RIBBONS


- 4-1. Wear of Awards and Decorations. Awards, decorations, and ribbons described in CAPR 39-3 will be worn only by CAP members for whom they have been authorized, and only on the uniforms listed in table 4-1. Awards, decorations, and ribbons will not be worn on the overcoat, topcoat, or raincoat.
- a. Arrangement of Ribbons on the Coat. See table 4-2 and figure 4-2.
- b. Placement of Devices on Ribbons and Medals. See CAPR 39-3.
- 4-2. Foreign Decorations. Foreign decorations are so many and so varied, the number and combinations that may be worn will not be prescribed. However, good taste and judgement must prevail, and the following guide must be used:
- a. Only decorations that have been duly approved by Congress for acceptance and wear by the individual may be worn.
- b. Personnel attending functions sponsored by a foreign nation should, as a courtesy, wear any decorations they have been awarded by that nation.


Figure 4-1. Arrangement Fourrageres and Lanyards

- 4-3. Fourrageres and Lanyards. Not more than one fourragere or lanyard will be worn at one time, and it will be worn on the left shoulder (see figure 4-1).


- 4-4. Military Service Awards. Military service awards may be worn on CAP uniforms. Awards of the Air Force, Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard, will be worn in the order prescribed by the awarding service, subject to the following:
- a. In all cases of relative priority, Air Force awards will take precedence.
- b. Awards for wars, campaigns, expeditions, etc. will be worn in chronological sequence.
- c. ROTC ribbons awarded by the military departments may be worn following all other ribbons (except foreign ribbons).


Figure 4-4. Order of Precedence - Senior Member Ribbons

- 4-5. Order of Precedence. Ribbons must be arranged in the order of precedence shown in figures 4-3 and 4-4. The ribbon with the highest precedence will be nearest to the lapel on the top row; other ribbons will follow in order of precedence, from right to left. The numbers on the ribbons in figure 4-2 show the order of arrangement.
- 4-6. Wear of Miniature Medals. Miniature medals are 1/2 the size of the large medals. They are authorized for all US decorations and service medals except the Medal of Honor. Miniature medals for CAP awards are authorized only where a large medal is authorized. Miniature medals for US decorations and CAP awards are optional for wear on the mess dress uniform by eligible personnel. The medals must be purchased at the wearer's expense. Medals will be arranged on the mess dress jacket as depicted in figure 4-5 with the medal of the highest precedence nearest the lapel; other medals will follow in the order of precedence from right to left. (Order of precedence for the medals are the same as for the ribbons outlined in figure 4-4.)










Chapter 5

INSIGNIA, BADGES, AND DEVICES

SECTION A - GRADE INSIGNIA

5-1. Wear of Grade Insignia. Table 5-1 prescribes the wear of grade insignia. The grade insignia may be worn on the clothing items shown in this table, but will not be worn on

other items. Figures 5-1 through 5-8 illustrate wear of, or describe, officers' and airmen's grade insignia.

SECTION B - BADGES AND DEVICES

- 5-2. Wear of Badges and Devices. Only those badges and devices described below will be worn on the CAP uniform. If at any time, more than one badge or device is authorized for wear in the same position on the uniform, the member will select one, to the exclusion of all others, for wear in that position. Special badges or devices designed for specific purposes will be worn only for the duration of the special duty and will not be worn as a part of the regular uniform.
- a. CAP Identification Badge. Two identification badges are authorized—one for senior members and one for cadets (figure 5-9). The badge will be worn as shown below:
- (1) Male. Worn centered one-half inch above the right breast pocket of the service coat and the shirt when worn as an outergarment.
- (2) Female. Worn centered immediately above the name plate, or if the name plate is not worn, the identification badge will be centered one-half inch above the right breast pocket of the service coat and the shirt when worn as an outergarment.
- b. Lapel, Collar, and Senior Member Flight Cap Insignia. The letters "CAP" in oxidized silver metal will be worn on the collar of the shirt when worn as an outergarment and on the lapels of the service coat (see figure 5-10) and on the senior member flight cap (see figure 5-14).
- c. Senior Member Service Hat Insignia. Oxidized silver color metal. Officer and airman insignia is depicted in figure 5-13.
- d. Cadet Flight Cap and Service Hat Insignia (same insignia for both). Cadet airmen will wear the cloth emblem on the flight cap and cadet officers will wear the metal emblem on the service hat (if the service hat is authorized by

- the wing commander) as depicted in figures 5-11 and 5-12. (Note that this insignia is worn on the flight cap by cadet airmen only. Cadet officers wear the grade insignia on the flight cap.)
- e. Buttons. Oxidized silver color metal buttons of suitable composition and weight, circular and slightly convex with raised rim, bearing the seal of the Civil Air Patrol in clear relief against a horizontally lined background (figure 5-15).

f. Aviation Badges:

- (1) Members who have been awarded a CAP aeronautical rating will wear one aviation badge centered one-half inch above the left breast pocket of coat, jackets, and shirts worn as outergarments. When ribbons are worn, the badge will be worn centered one-half inch above the ribbons. If a specialty badge is worn, the aviation badge will be worn centered one-half inch above the specialty badge, except that the Chaplain's Specialty Badge will be worn above the aviation badge (see figure 5-16).
- (2) One United States military aviation badge, if awarded by military authorities, may be worn centered one-half inch above the CAP identification badge.

(3) Foreign Badges:

- (a) One foreign aviation badge may be worn centered one-half inch above the CAP identification badge; however, it may not be worn if a U. S. military aviation badge is worn. To be eligible, the senior member must have earned the badge through qualification as evidenced in writing by a foreign agency.
- (b) Badges acquired as gifts or souvenirs do not qualify as earned badges and will not be worn on the uniform.

- g. Name Plate. The standard CAP name plate is an optional item; however, its wear is encouraged (see description in figure 5-17). The name plate will be worn as follows:
- (1) Male. Worn centered immediately below the CAP identification badge one-half inch below the seam of the right breast pocket flap of the service coat and the shirt when worn as an outergarment.
- (2) Female. Worn centered one-half inch above the right breast pocket (and immediately beneath the CAP identification badge).
- h. Shoulder Patches. Either a wing or regional shoulder patch must be worn by all CAP members. Members of the regional staff and NEC members representing regions will wear a regional patch. All other members will wear a wing shoulder patch. Members who are not affiliated with an organization within a wing or region (for example, members of the National Headquarters Membership Unit) are exempt from this requirement. Only one shoulder patch will be worn, and it will be located one-half inch below the shoulder seam of the left sleeve of all coats (except raincoats), jackets, shirts worn as outergarments, and flying suits (figure 5-18).
- i. Specialty Insignia. Chaplains, medical officers, and nurses will wear their specialty insignia centered one-half inch above the left breast pocket of jackets, coats, or shirts worn as outergarments (figure 5-19). If ribbons are worn, the specialty insignia will be worn one-half inch above these. If an aviation badge is also worn, the specialty insignia will be centered one-half inch above the ribbons and one-half inch beneath the aviation badge, except that the chaplains insignia will be worn one-half inch above the aviation badge.
- j. CAP Communicator's Badge. The CAP communicator's badge will be worn centered below the pocket flap (or simulated opening) on the left breast pocket (see figure 5-20).
- k. Gunnery and Small Arms Qualifying Badges. Cadets may wear one Junior National Rifle Association Marksmanship Badge that has been earned in accordance with the NAR program. Male cadets will wear the badge with the top edge centered on the left pocket flap of the service coat or shirt worn as an outergarment. Female cadets will wear the badge with the top edge centered one-half inch below the top edge of the left pocket of the service coat. None will be worn on the female shirt. Other gunnery and small arms badges will not be worn on the uniform.

- l. Cadet NCO Leadership Shoulder Insignia. Noncommissioned officer leadership shoulder insignia is worn by Phase II cadets who are appointed to the positions of cadet flight sergeant, cadet first sergeant, cadet academic sergeant, cadet administrative assistant, cadet squad leader, cadet guide, cadet guidon bearer and cadet color guard. The insignia is worn centered on the right shoulder (figure 5-21).
- m. Organizational Emblem. See table 2-3, item 13.
- n. Model Rocketry Badge. The Model Rocketry Badge may be worn by cadets when earned in accordance with the Civil Air Patrol Model Rocketry Program (CAPM 50-20). Male cadets will wear the badge centered on the left pocket of the service coat or shirt when worn as an outergarment. Female cadets will wear the badge with the top edge centered one-half inch below the top edge of the left pocket of the service coat. The badge will not be worn on the female shirt. (See figure 5-22.)
- o. CAP Enamel Mess Dress Seal (figure 5-23). The enamel seal will be worn affixed to the lower right front of the mess dress jacket as depicted in figure 2-5 and figure 3-3.
- p. CAP Communications Patch (figure 5-20). May be worn by members qualified for the Communications Specialty Identification Badge in accordance with CAPM 100-1. Patch will be worn centered on the left breast pocket of the male utility shirt. The patch will not be worn on any CAP uniform, except the utility uniform.
- q. CAP National Staff College Badge. Graduates of the CAP National Staff College will wear the CAP National Staff College Badge centered below the pocket flap (or simulated opening) on the left breast pocket of all uniform combinations. The badge may also be worn in lieu of the CAP crest on the CAP blazer on an optional basis (see figure 5-24).
- r. CAP Cloth Seal (figure 5-25). (Optional. May be authorized by the wing commander for wear on flying clothing only.) The seal will be worn on the right breast of the flying jacket/coveralls. This seal will not be worn on any CAP uniform, except flying clothing.
- s. Emergency Services Patch (figure 5-26). (Optional. May be authorized by the wing commander for wear on flying clothing only.) The emergency services patch may be worn by cadets and senior members qualified to participate in emergency services missions in ac-

cordance with CAPM 50-15. The patch will be worn on the right breast of the flying jacket/coveralls and centered on the front of the baseball-type flying caps (if these caps are authorized by the wing commander). The patch will not be worn on any CAP uniform, except flying clothing.


t. Emergency Services Decal (figure 5-27).

(Optional. May be authorized by the wing commander for wear on the white helmet liner by members participating in emergency services missions (see chapter 7). The emergency services decal will be worn centered on the front on the white helmet liner by cadets and senior members participating in emergency services missions.










Figure 5-3. Chevrons Denoting Senior Member Airman Grades





Figure 5-4. Shoulder Strap Insignia of Senior Member Officer Grade






Figure 5-6. Cadet Officer Grade on the Shoulder Boards





Figure 5—7. Cadet Officer Grade on the Shoulder Straps (Raincoat, overcoat, topcoat, and lightweight blue jacket)



Figure 5-8. Chevrons Denoting Cadet Airmen Grades







Figure 5-11. Cadet Flight Cap Insignia (Airmen and Officers)




Figure 5-13. Senior Member Service Cap/Hat Insignia




Figure 5-16. Aviation Badges




Figure 5-17. Name Plate




Figure 5-19. Speciality Insignia






THE CAP BLAZER




Figure 6-1. Men's Blazer

- 6-1. Men. The CAP blazer and slacks combination (figure 6-1) may be worn by all male members of the Civil Air Patrol regardless of grade. It consists of:
- a. Coat. Blazer type, semiform-fitted, drape, single-breasted, two- or three-button model with one breast patch pocket, two lower patch pockets, and rear vent. Material is dark blue flannel, tropical worsted, or similar commercial blend. It is ornamented by the CAP crest (figure 6-3), attached or sewn to the breast pocket.
- b. Trousers. Medium gray flannel or tropical worsted material, full cut, straight hanging, pleated or unpleated, cuffed or uncuffed.
 - c. Shirt. White, dress type.
 - d. Necktie. Conservative, solid color.
- e. Footwear. Shoes, black; socks, black or dark blue.
- 6-2. Women. The CAP blazer and skirt combination (figure 6-2) may be worn by all female members of the Civil Air Patrol regardless of grade. It consists of:

- a. Coat. Form-fitted, three-button, commercial model blazer with one breast patch pocket and two lower patch pockets. Material is dark blue flannel, tropical worsted, or similar commercial blend. It is ornamented by the CAP crest (figure 6-3), attached or sewn to the breast pocket.
- b. Skirt. Straightor A-line. Medium gray flannel, tropical worsted, or similar commercial blend.
- c. Blouse. White, simple design, without ruffles or excessive ornamentation.
- d. Footwear. Either black tailored pumps or black leather loafers with neutral nylon hose, as appropriate.
- 6-3. When Worn. The blazer may be worn during any season of the year. It is encouraged for wear at CAP social occasions in lieu of the service uniform. It may be worn without restriction on non-CAP occasions.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS WHICH MAY BE AUTHORIZED BY THE WING COMMANDER

- 7-1. General. Wing commanders may authorize certain items to be worn for specific purposes within their respective wings or within specific units of their wings. Examples of purposes of these items are to identify members of special CAP groups such as rangers, drill teams, bands, color guards, and members participating in emergency services missions.
- 7-2. Where and When Worn. In all cases, these items will have no national significance or recognition as a part of the CAP uniform. They will not be worn at summer encampments nor national events (cadet exchange, jet orientation courses, etc.), unless specifically authorized by National Headquarters. They may be worn only while performing the duty for which the use of the items were authorized. For example, a bandsman authorized to wear a white belt, shoulder cords, and leggings, may not wear these items except while performing duty with the band.
- 7-3. Items Which May be Authorized by the Wing Commander. The wing commander has authority to approve the following items for wear within his wing:

- a. Shoulder cords (fourrageres, lanyards, etc.) Not more than one fourragere or lanyard will be worn at one time, and it will be worn on the left shoulder (see figure 4-1). Color to be determined by the wing commander except the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Region/Wing Cadet Advisory Council will wear the colors prescribed in CAPR 50-8.
 - b. Leggings.
 - c. Scarves.
 - d. White gloves.
 - e. White and black belts.
- f. Helmet liners (Color to be determined by wing commander. Except that helmet liners authorized for wear by members participating in emergency services missions will be white and will be worn with the decal depicted in figure 5-27).
- g. Berets (other than blue beret authorized all female members. Color to be determined by wing commander).

Summary of Revised, Deleted, or Added Material

This revision adds a table of contents and a special chapter on additional items which may be approved by the wing commander (chapter 7). It corrects information published in the previous manual on cadet headgear (chapter 5). This manual also incorporates the newly authorized mess dress uniform for senior members (chapters 2 and 3) and authorizes the wear of certain miniature medals on the mess dress (chapter 4). Figures have been added to show the order of precedence for ribbons worn on the CAP uniform (chapter 4). It includes the new female beret and blue service uniform (chapter 3). The cotton cord blue/white striped service uniform for women was phased out 1 May 1969 and was thusly eliminated from the new manual (chapter 3). The heavyweight blue flight uniform for women is no longer available for purchase and has been eliminated from the revised manual (chapter 3). All badges and special devices approved for wear since publication of the previous manual have been added to chapter 5.
