



## **MID ATLANTIC REGION SUPPLEMENT 1**

### **CAP REGULATION 39-1**

### **CIVIL AIR PATROL UNIFORM REGULATION**

CAP Regulation 39-1, dated 3 March 2020, including ICL 21-01 dated 9 August 2021 and ICL 25-02 dated 16 April 2025 and ICL 25-06 dated 4 November 2025, is supplemented as follows:

Paragraph 1.2.9. Added. Cold Weather/Inclement Conditions Uniforms. In cold weather, commanders and activity directors will prioritize protection from the elements over adherence to CAP uniform standards.

Paragraph 5.1.1.1.2.2. Added. Wear of the Wing patch is mandatory on Utility uniforms (ABU, OCP, Corporate Field), no later than 60 days past approval of this supplement.

Paragraph 5.1.1.2 Amended. Unit logos on t-shirts are authorized but must meet the current design and heraldry standards of Civil Air Patrol and approved by the Wing Historian. Designs must be submitted to the Wing Director of Personnel for approval by the Wing Uniform Board and Wing Commander.

Paragraph 5.1.1.2.1 Added. Units that currently do not meet this standard are authorized to wear their current t-shirt until they are no longer serviceable. They are not authorized to purchase additional t-shirts that do not meet this standard.

Paragraph 5.1.1.2.2 Added. Activity t-shirts from any CAP activity are authorized for wear under the uniform outside of the activity as long as they meet the color and construction of the requirements for the specific uniform. Neither unit designation emblems nor clothing company logos will be visible when wearing the ABU or OCP coat (shirt).

Paragraph 6.2.8.1 Added. Members of the Mid-Atlantic Region Headquarters Unit (MAR-MAR-001) and personnel assigned to duties in that unit are authorized to wear CAP Baseball Caps as defined in this paragraph for wear with the Aviator Shirt Uniform, Corporate Field Uniform, Corporate working uniform, Flight Duty Uniform, and Corporate-Style Flight Duty Uniform when performing MAR duties.

Paragraph 6.2.8.2 Added. The cap shall be a standard baseball cap design, single color navy blue. The brim of the cap shall be facing forward when worn.

Paragraph 6.2.8.3. Added. The cap shall have either the unit charter (MAR-001) number in white or the approved MAR patch on the front of the cap.

Paragraph 6.2.8.4 Added. MAR Emergency Services-qualified personnel engaged in actual or training missions, or during other Emergency Services activities at the discretion of the Commander, Activity Director or Incident Commander may wear a standard baseball cap design, single color blaze or bright orange CAP Baseball Cap. The cap shall have either the unit charter (MAR-001) number in black or the approved MAR patch on the front of the cap.

Paragraph 6.2.8.5 Added. High Visibility (Hi-Vis) Orange baseball caps (or Hi-Vis watch caps during cold weather only) are optional during actual SAR missions and only for SAR training activities as authorized by an activity director. Hi-Vis Orange baseball caps are to be worn only during the mission/activity, not to include travel to and from the mission/activity.

Paragraph 6.2.8.5.1 Added. Members may have their last name embroidered in black lettering, not to exceed  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch in height,  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch from top of opening and centered on the back of the cap. No other patches, writing, or insignias are authorized. No rank is authorized on this cap.

Paragraph 6.2.8.5.1.1 Added. Hi-Vis Watch Cap may be worn during cold weather only. Cap will fit snugly over top of head (tight fit). Adjust cap so it may fit squarely on head. Fold edge of cap all the way around, adjust crease so that the folded edge is no more than 3 inches wide. The back of the cap should run across the nape of the neck and the front should rest within  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch of the eyebrows. The watch cap should reflect a diagonal line across the ears moving downwards, from front to back. No bunching and no sagging. No rank is authorized on this cap.

Paragraph 6.2.8.5.2 Added. Hi-Vis Orange baseball caps are not authorized for wear as a Unit Baseball Cap or at any other activity except as outlined in 6.2.8.5. Must be maintained in a clean and serviceable condition.

Paragraph 6.2.8.5.3 Added. Not authorized for wear with the FDU or CFDU.

Paragraph 6.5.1.2.1 Added. Activity t-shirts from any CAP activity are authorized for wear with the ABU, FDU, OCP, CFDU, and CFU uniform outside of the activity. T-shirts must meet the design, color, and construction requirements for the specific uniform. Neither emblems nor clothing company logos will be visible when wearing the coat (shirt). T-shirts must represent CAP in a positive manner. T-shirts are authorized for wear throughout Mid-Atlantic Region at all meetings and activities at all echelons.

Paragraph 8.1.1.1.1. Added. Senior Members who have or previously had a CAP aeronautical rating or who have a current aircrew mission qualification may wear the FDU/CFDU when working or utility uniforms are authorized. Unit commanders and activity directors may restrict wear when the member will not be conducting flight duties.

Paragraph 8.1.1.1.2. Added. Personnel who do not meet the requirements in 8.1.1.1.1. may wear the FDU/CFDU on days when flight duty is planned or anticipated (e.g. preflight planning, in-flight). This includes, but is not limited to:

Paragraph 8.1.1.1.2.1. Added. Cadets who have or previously had a CAP aeronautical rating or who have a current aircrew mission qualification. If part of a meeting or another activity, cadets must be in the prescribed meeting/activity uniform when not engaged in flights or flight-related duties.

Paragraph 8.1.1.1.2.2. Added. Cadets taking an orientation flight. If part of a meeting or another activity, cadets must be in the prescribed meeting/activity uniform when not engaged in orientation flights or related orientation flight activities.

Paragraph 8.1.1.1.2.3. Added. Members training for an aeronautical rating or aircrew mission qualification.

Paragraph 9.4.1.1 Added. The Mid-Atlantic Region Cadet of the Year, Junior Cadet Officer of the Year, and Cadet NCO of the Year may wear a royal blue and yellow box braid cord with yellow as the exterior color. The cadets may wear the cord through 15 March of the year after selection (e.g. 2025 Cadet of the Year selected in 2026 may wear through 15 March 2027). Recipients who convert to adult members during this period are authorized to wear the cord through the same date. These cords are authorized for wear throughout Mid-Atlantic Region at all meetings and activities at all echelons.

Paragraph 9.4.1.2 Added. Cadet members of the winning team for the Mid-Atlantic Region Cadet Competition are authorized to wear the cadet competition cord starting with the competition award ceremony through the day prior to the next region competition, unless other dates are authorized by the region commander through a personnel authorization. The cord will be a white and green box braid cord with white as the exterior color. These cords are authorized for wear throughout Mid-Atlantic Region at all meetings and activities at all echelons.

Paragraph 9.4.1.3 Added. Cadets serving as Event Marshals at the Mid-Atlantic Region Cadet Competition are authorized to wear a white and black box braid cord with white as the exterior color. Cadets serving as Cadet Operations Assistants at the competition are authorized to wear a solid black box braid cord. Cords authorized in this paragraph are only authorized for wear during the onsite competition

Paragraph 9.5.1. Added. When authorized by the activity director, members engaged in flight line marshalling duties at an activity may wear a high visibility yellow or orange t-shirt and brimmed hat to provide visibility and protect from heat/sun. T-shirt may be plain or have an approved unit patch design (IAW para 10.9.7.) on the left side of the chest or on the back. High visibility yellow or orange t-shirts from any CAP event may also be worn. The Encampment Commander may prescribe for wear for encampment flight line operations high visibility yellow or orange T-shirt with the encampment emblem. Any other design or t-shirt color requires Wing Commander approval.

Paragraph 10.9.5. Added. The Wing Shield patch shall be worn no later than 60 days past approval of this supplement.
